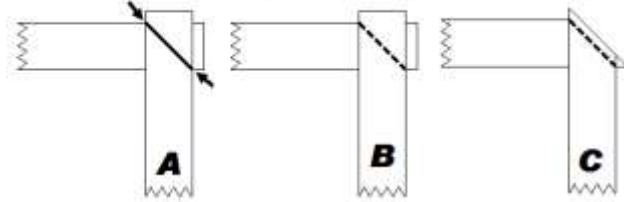


Quilt of Many Colors RGR112

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4) **Sashing fabric strips (shown in white)**



Full/Queen: Join a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x wof **SASHING fabric** strip to a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $\frac{1}{2}$ wof strip by making a diagonal seam. King size: Join (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips together. With right sides together, place the ends of the two strips as shown in Figure A. Draw a line where indicated by the arrows. Sew on the diagonal line (Figure B). And trim the corner excess to a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Figure C). Repeat to create a total of three sets of joined **Sashing fabric** strips.

- 5) In a perfect world the rows should measure $55\frac{1}{2}$ " (King size $74\frac{1}{2}$ ") however; measure the width of each of your four rows of blocks. If they differ in length, determine the average length for our four rows. Measure and cut your sashing strips to your average width. Attach the strips to the bottom of Rows #1, #2 & #3. Press the seam allowances towards the sashing strip(s).
